Rector's Ramble

Dear friends,

Happy New Year and welcome you to the January 2026 edition of the St Peter's Chailey's Church & Community Magazine.

Please do look at our diary of services this month and next as St Peter's will be closed whilst essential works are carried out to repair the flooring. Thank you to St Martin's Chailey Heritage Chapel, The Five Bells and St Mary's Newick for offering us a welcome on the relevant Sunday's whilst the works are completed. Please pray that all goes according to plan and we can be back in St P's before Easter.

As the calendar turns, many of us embark on the familiar ritual of setting New Year's resolutions. Whether it's promising to exercise more, save better, or deepen relationships, these intentions arrive from a heartfelt urge to reconnect with what truly matters. Yet, by February, many resolutions quietly fade away, lost under the weight of life's relentless pace. Perhaps what we actually need isn't a longer list of goals but a renewed sense of focus.

This is where the Christian season of Epiphany can offer a guiding light. Epiphany, meaning "manifestation" or "appearance," celebrates the moment Christ reveals himself to the Gentiles, symbolised by the three kings – or Magi – following a star to find the infant Jesus, and it proclaims a bold truth: Jesus came to save the whole world, not just one nation or people.

Epiphany invites us to welcome the light of Christ into our hearts just as the Magi followed the star to find the Saviour. Epiphany challenges us to seek God's guidance in all things, letting divine wisdom shape what truly matters in our lives and communities.

Consider the Magi: learned and wealthy, yet they didn't rely solely on their own understanding. They sought and trusted God's direction throughout their journey. Their story poses important questions for us: How might we align our daily actions and our resolutions with a deeper, more intentional purpose?

Adopting this perspective transforms New Year's resolutions from mere checklists into paths of intentional living. It might mean making space in our day for quiet reflection, committing to serve others in our community, or managing our resources more responsibly. Whatever the goal, Epiphany highlights the importance of lives shaped by God's character – humble, persistent, and faithful.

The Magi's journey was neither quick nor easy. They faced barriers but pressed on, trusting in God's provision. Likewise, when we choose to *embrace change—whether personal or communal*—it rarely happens overnight. Setbacks are inevitable, but the Epiphany story reminds us that perseverance intertwined with faith is key. Even when progress feels slow or uncertain, we can trust that God is working in and through us.

There is a less often told but profoundly important story of Epiphany that speaks directly to our current social and political realities. As we looked back on 2025, we saw a worrying upswing in far-right politics, often accompanied by a co-option of Christian symbols and language. This agenda frequently casts asylum seekers and those of other faiths as threats, sometimes even quietly undermining the sense of welcome within our churches and communities.

Yet, right at the heart of both the Christmas and Epiphany narratives lies the story of a refugee family – Jesus, Mary, and Joseph fleeing to Egypt to escape King Herod’s deadly slaughter of the innocents. This isn’t just a sentimental backdrop but a stark tale of political violence, terror, and forced displacement.

Egypt was a logical and safe place to find refuge. Egypt and Judea were linked by a coastal road known as the Via Maris (Way of the Sea). Egypt was outside the dominions of King Herod but was part of the Roman Empire and had large Jewish communities. The Jewish settlements of Egypt dated back to the time of Jeremiah (see Jeremiah 41.17 and 44.1). They had their own synagogues and had adopted Greek as their everyday language. The first translation of the Scriptures, which we call the Septuagint, was made in the third century BC at Alexandria in Egypt, originally for these Greek-speaking Jews. Though the Bible doesn’t use the modern term “refugee,” its demand to welcome and love outsiders is crystal clear: “The foreigner residing among you must be treated as your native born. Love them as yourself, for you were foreigners in Egypt” (Leviticus 19:34). Remarkably, Jesus’ very early life embodies this command before he ever spoke a word. We know little of their years in exile, but the theme of hospitality to strangers’ echoes throughout the Gospels. Jesus later instructs, “I was a stranger, and you took me in” (Matthew 25:35). And the Letter to the Hebrews counsels, “Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers” (Hebrews 13:2). These powerful reminders call us to resist politics driven by fear and exclusion, and instead to live out Christ’s vision for a world rooted in joy, hope, peace, and love.

Epiphany invites to look beyond ourselves. The light of Christ is not something to keep hidden—it’s meant to illuminate and guide our actions and our words in the world around us. As you consider your 2026 resolutions, I encourage you to include an inclusive sharing of that light with others. Step into the new year with hope and purpose, ready for the encounters that will turn strangers into friends and transform communities into places of welcome and belonging.

Thank you for being part of our church family and community.

May this season bring you fresh insight, resilience, and joy as we journey together in faith.

Keep the faith and keep doing the small things that make a big difference—to those you love and to those in need.

Chailey Commons Society

A Happy New Year to everyone. It is always good to know that we are past the Winter equinox, and the days will start to lengthen. The full moon on January 3rd is called the Wolf Moon - gets us off to a good start – apparently it is named after the howling of hungry wolves lamenting the scarcity of food in midwinter. Other names for this month's full moon include old moon and ice moon.

Since September, the five Exmoor were grazing in nearby fields kindly provided by neighbours. This was following the loss of two ponies with suspected acorn poisoning. The team of pony checkers have been diligently taking care of them. At the time of writing in December we plan to release them back on the common. We hope the ponies will resume their usual grazing behaviour selecting more gorse, bramble and holly in addition to heathland grasses. For the last four years they have come through the winter in excellent condition. If, however, there are more problems, the ponies will be off the common until next Spring. Please look for updates on Red House Common notice board.

Please do not feed the ponies which can also endanger their health as they thrive on a low nutrient diet and under normal conditions the heathland provides all that they need, please do not throw any grass cuttings or prunings on to the common as this can cause poisoning and colic.

Our activities for 2026 will again include a Birch Cutting session to prepare more brushwood for our besom brooms on Sunday January 11th from 09.30 until 1.00.p.m. Join us for an outdoor workout cutting and bundling birch on Red House Common. Meet at the car park, bring your own gloves, secateurs, or loppers if you have them. If you would like to take part in the birch cutting, please contact Chailey Commons Society (mail@chaileychcommons.org.uk) in advance so that we can get you registered as a volunteer.

If anyone has surplus vegetables of any kind to add to the soup they will be most welcome.

THE SUNDAY SCHOOL TREAT - is now arranged to be held on Saturday February 12th at 4.00 pm. The children (who are reminded to bring with them their mugs) are assured of having a very happy time. Parents and friends will be welcome after tea.

Chailey Horticultural Society

Now all the festivities are over and it's cold and wet outside the time has come to review the past year and plan for the future.

Here are a few of my thoughts from how things went in 2025.

I'll start with tomatoes which are a basic staple for any vegetable garden. In the greenhouse I grow mainly beefsteak varieties as they do badly outside in our climate. The two varieties that I would recommend are Buffalosteak and Country Taste. These can be bought as plug plants or grown from seed. In general big varieties mature later than traditional greenhouse types but they do make wonderful tomato sauce!

The two standard varieties for the greenhouse that I would recommend are Shirley which produces a plentiful crop of medium sized fruit of a good flavour and Golden Delicious for small yellow fruit with a tinge of orange. They do have tendency to split which is why they are not usually available in shops but their flavour is outstanding so don't be tricked into buying "improved" varieties as they do not have the same flavour. For those who like their tomatoes red Gardeners Delight is a good alternative.

Outside I only grow blight resistant varieties and here I would recommend Crimson Plum and Cocktail Crush for medium sized tomatoes and Crimson Cherry for smaller fruit.

Remember tomatoes need horse manure, soot, lime and magnesium sulphate in the soil and to be fed with a seaweed based feed.

For the amateur gardener it's really only worth growing first early and second early potatoes. For very early first earlies Swift is the best but Red Duke of York and Sharpes Express come bit later and have better flavour. For second earlies I think Charlotte is the one of choice. All these can be grown in the ground or in potato sacks or old dustbins. They can be planted in late February or early March if given some warmth and protection such as in a greenhouse.

Owing to advancing age I've had to give up my vegetable plot at Balneath Manor and this has concentrated my mind on to what is really worth growing if space is limited.

The obvious 'must' is herbs as they are continually needed but often in relatively small quantities. Thyme, sage and rosemary can easily be grown in large pots and will last for years. Chives and garlic chives can be grown in pots or old window boxes and will keep going for a number of years. Basil, dill, parsley and coriander have to be repeatedly sown annually but again do well in old window boxes.

Then one has to think what gives better flavour when homegrown. The answer of course is most things but one I value most is fresh peas so try Douce Provence. If space allows dwarf French beans and runner beans are well worth it.

Most salad crops do well in old window boxes and buying in half a dozen plants at a time allows for continual production.

Chard is well worth growing since it lasts through out the year, is very versatile in the kitchen and almost impossible to buy. I prefer the old fashioned white silver type over the rainbow varieties. This is because it is more vigorous, stands better through the winter and the thick white stems are delicious.

Somethings I just like growing and foremost amongst these are chillies. They produce attractive

plants that can be grown in pots. The number of varieties is huge so unless you already have a favourite try Prairie Fire for small hot little chillies growing on an attractive small plant or Cayenne for standard sized hot red chillies good in the kitchen. But for the really decadent amongst you I recommend Bishops Crown. When red cut in half and remove the seeds and pith and fill with cream cheese. Then go and find a glass of red wine and sit down and relax!

Incredibly, we attempted over 800 repairs this year and over 7000 items since we first opened our doors in 2018. We were delighted to receive an award this year from Lewes District Council in recognition of our service to the community

We always get a lot of Christmas tree lights coming in at this time of year – if you have the old-

style lights with push in bulbs, we may be able to help with spares, but there are many different types, so at worst we can tell you what to look for and where to find them... And of course, our sharpening team will be busy, as always, at Christmas. We now have two state-of-the-art sharpening machines to sort out those knives ready for the turkey!

Our new posters and flyers with all our 2026 dates are now available at the Café; pick some up and spread the word wherever you live!

The success of Chailey Repair Café has been due in great measure to the support we have received from all of you in the local community – if you didn't have broken stuff, we'd have nothing to do! We have saved a lot of things from finding their way into landfill and provided an opportunity for folks to understand more about what makes their household items work!

PLEASE NOTE! St Peter's Church is having some well-deserved refurbishment from January onwards. Chailey Repair Café will be moving back to Chailey Village Hall, (next to the Five Bells just 500 yards down the road from the Church) from 10th January until the work in the church is completed.

Lewes Local Plan

Lewes District Council is developing a new Local Plan that will guide how our area grows and changes up to 2040. This Plan will set the framework for delivering housing, jobs, community facilities, and services needed by residents, workers, and visitors, while ensuring growth is sustainable and well-managed.

By the time you read this article, the revised copy of the Lewes Local Plan will have been presented to District Councillors for approval. (meeting scheduled for the 11th December 2025). Assuming that the Plan has been approved, then public consultation will begin shortly after approval.

The consultation window will be short (closing date 28th February 2026) so it is vital that as many residents as possible take part. A strong response is important: when the Plan is examined by a Planning Inspector, the level of community engagement and public support will be a key consideration.

Without an up-to-date Local Plan, the district is increasingly vulnerable to speculative and uncontrolled development, making this process urgent. The new proposal sets out a clearer, more strategic approach to identifying development sites—focusing on location, infrastructure capacity, environmental protection, and transport.

Key principles include:

- Protecting rural areas from development that would harm landscape character or biodiversity.

- Concentrating growth in and around Tier 1 and 2 settlements, where public transport and active travel options are strongest. Chailey is classed as Tiers 4 and 5, reflecting limited local services and reduced access to sustainable transport—meaning it is not considered suitable for significant planned growth.

- Ensuring development proposals demonstrate how they prioritise transport solutions such as walking, wheeling, cycling, public transport, shared mobility, and private vehicles. Local Plan allocations will be required to:

- Provide or support early delivery of effective public transport and active travel links.

- Include comprehensive walking and cycling networks.

- Deliver mobility-hub infrastructure connecting homes with services and employment areas.

- Avoid any development that undermines sustainable transport or increases car dependency.

Newick, Lewes and Uckfield Arts Society

14th January 2026 Dr Colin Shindler 'Screening the Novel, Books into Films.'

Colin Shindler has been lecturing on American and British social and cultural history for over 30 years. He won a BAFTA award for his production of 'A Little Princess', though he regards his greatest cultural contribution as choosing the title music for the police series Juliet Bravo. 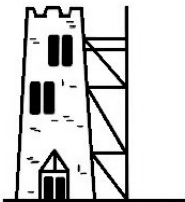

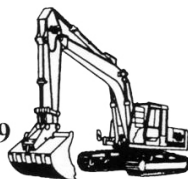

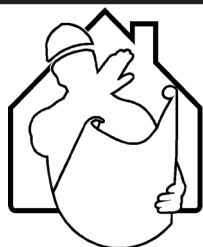
