Rectors Ramble

"The Spirit drove him out into the wilderness, and he was there for forty days, being tempted by Satan. He was with the wild animals, and angels attended him".
Mark 1:11-13

Dear friends,

Welcome to the February 2026 edition of the St Peter's Chailey's Church & Community Magazine. *'I always give in to temptation', wrote George Bernard Shaw, 'because I find that what is bad for me does not tempt me.'*

If only it were true! Seven weeks or so ago, many of us made New Year resolutions.

I wonder how many are still being kept?

Or are we more like the man who said giving up chocolate was easy – he'd done it dozens of times! Some people find it helpful to distinguish between doing wrong and being wrong.

Who knows what would have happened if Adam and Eve had admitted their guilt straight away? But we all know that, so very often doing wrong leads to being wrong. We search for reasons for acting as we did; we blame our environment, our education, or someone else.

Adam blames Eve: Eve blames the serpent; and the serpent's 'he said that; but what did he mean?' is, quite literally, the oldest trick in the book!

Mark, in his account of the temptation, uses an interesting phrase. He says that Jesus 'was with the wild animals, and angels attended him.' It has been suggested that this represents the psychological truth that while we resist temptation, it remains fascinating, alluring, dangerous.

It is when we admit the reality of what tempts us that it can be converted into a strength, because it loses its power over us. It becomes, not our master, but our servant.

In Matthew's account of this event, we see something of the process by which Jesus achieved this, and presumably taught his disciples. It shows that sin, as Paul reminded the church at Rome, has to be worked for; but grace comes as a free gift!

The characteristic notes of Lent are self-examination, penitence, self-denial, study, and preparation for Easter, to which almsgiving has traditionally been added, and we are reminded that we come into the world with nothing – so whenever we give, it means we're handing over something that we in turn have received.

How might our awareness of Christ's 'salvation history' – and our own history – impact upon our own readiness to increase our giving to St Peter's which has served our community with generosity and hope for so many years?

Could you're giving this year enable us to secure a future for St Peter's for many generations to come?

As we enter the season of Lent, on Ash Wednesday 18th February, the Church invites us once again to walk with Jesus into the wilderness. For forty days and forty nights, Jesus stepped away from the familiar and the comfortable, into a place of testing, prayer and dependence on God. Lent is not about punishment or deprivation for its own sake, but about attentiveness: learning again what truly sustains us when familiar supports are stripped away.

This Lent feels especially resonant for us at St Peter's Chailey, because we too find ourselves in an unexpected wilderness of sorts. As many of you know, St Peter's is currently closed while the long-awaited new floor is installed. The doors are shut, the pews are stacked, and the building that has held our prayers, baptisms, weddings, funerals and quiet moments for generations is temporarily silent. For many of us, that absence is keenly felt. Holy spaces matter, and when they are taken away, even for good reasons, we notice how deeply rooted they are in our lives.

Yet Lent reminds us that wilderness times are not wasted time. In the Bible, the wilderness is often where God does some of God's deepest work: shaping identity, clarifying purpose, renewing trust. Jesus' forty days prepared him for public ministry. The people of Israel learned dependence and obedience in the desert. And so, as we find ourselves without St Peter's for a season, we are invited to see this not only as an inconvenience to endure, but as an opportunity to reflect on who

we are as a church beyond bricks and mortar.

Church, after all, has never been only a building. It is a people, gathered in faith, rooted in prayer, and sent out in love. Over these weeks, we are being reminded of that truth in very practical ways. We are discovering that the Body of Christ stretches beyond our walls, and that hospitality, generosity and partnership are gifts to be received with gratitude.

We offer sincere thanks to The Five Bells pub, which has stepped into an unexpected roll with our breakfast service at 9:30 on the first Sunday of the Month in February & March. There is something quietly beautiful about prayer and conversation happening around tables more often associated with meals and friendship. It echoes the ministry of Jesus himself, who so often taught, listened and welcomed people at the table. In these gatherings we are reminded that sacred moments can happen anywhere, and that community is often strengthened when we meet one another on common ground.

We give heartfelt thanks first to St Martin's Chapel at Chailey Heritage, whose welcome has been both warm and generous on the second and fourth Sundays, whilst the church is closed. To worship in that chapel is to be reminded of faith lived with resilience and hope, and of God's presence among all God's people. We are grateful for the openness with which space has been shared, and for the spirit of kindness that has made us feel at home.

And we are deeply thankful to our sister congregation at St Mary's, Newick, for their generosity and partnership during this time. Their hospitality is a living sign of the wider Church at work: congregations supporting one another, not out of obligation, but out of shared faith and mutual care. In worshipping alongside them, we are reminded that we are part of something much bigger than our own parish.

Lent is a season of waiting, of patience, of trusting that God is at work even when progress feels slow or uncertain. The new floor at St Peter's will, in time, be laid. The doors will reopen. The familiar rhythms will return, renewed and strengthened. But we hope that we will not simply return to "how things were".

Instead, may we carry forward what this wilderness season has taught us: gratitude for one another, openness to partnership, and a deeper awareness that God walks with us wherever we gather.

As we journey through Lent together, may we be attentive to God's presence in unfamiliar places, thankful for the kindness we have received, and hopeful for the new life that always follows the wilderness.

And when we do finally step back into St Peter's, may we do so with hearts enlarged by this season of shared pilgrimage, and if there is anyone of you who is looking to explore the idea of Baptism or Confirmation please be in touch, as we will be announcing our dates for our Deanery Confirmation very soon.

Have a great month, be joyful, keep the faith and keep doing the little things that make a difference to those you love and those in need.

From the Parish Leaflet for February

Our Pound Day on February 15th: had a highly successful result this year, in spite of the very wet weather. The following letter has been received by Mrs Orton from Miss L Martin, the Appeals Organiser. 'It is with very great pleasure that I acknowledge the welcome remittance of £6 and the splendid contribution of approximately 250lbs and 10 dozen eggs to our household stores. Your valued support in this way is most encouraging and our warmest thanks are tendered to you and all your helpers. Will you please where possible also convey our gratitude to those who so kindly gave to this special appeal.'

Note: Originally Pound day was a community effort where people gave a pound of staples (sugar flour) or fresh produce to support the war effort Items were brought to collection points like the vicarage and transported to camps like Summerdown. Pound Days continued long after WW1 had ended due to severe food shortages.

Chailey Horticultural Society

Our 2026 schedule is now available. All members should have received their copy along with membership renewal forms and entry forms.

Schedules complete with membership forms and show entry forms are available from The Five Bells and any committee member. Our first show is on the 21st March in the village hall so please come along and support us or even better put in some entries!

Also keep an eye out for other events we plan to put on.

February can be a bit of a dismal month, often(cold , damp and dark but it does represent the beginning of the growing season with the increase in daylight hours.

Aubergines and chillies require a long growing season and should be planted before the end of February. A propagator is really essential to ensure germination. When the second lot of leaves appear transplant into pots. I use small biodegradable pots so movement into larger pots doesn't require root disturbance. They will still need heat and light so in the absence of a heated greenhouse make use of sunny windowsills and be prepared to move plants around. For chillies in pots try De Cayenne and Apache with scoville heat units around 50 to 60 thousand but if you wish to impress your friends (and maybe loose them!) offer them the wonderfully named Carolina Reaper with a heat measurement of 1.6 million!

For aubergines Money Maker is a good reliable standard. Also don't forget that all these can be bought as plug plants.

Greenhouse tomatoes and sweet peppers should also be planted by the end of the month. Buy in seed potatoes and set them to chit in a light dry frost free place. Old egg boxes are useful for this. The first earlies can be planted out at the end of the month in potato sacks or buckets which can be moved around so as to get maximum light and warmth

and avoid frosts.

Finish pruning apples, pears and quinces and ensure grease bands are in place.

One herb I omitted last month was Bay whose leaves are an essential ingredient of many dishes. It can be grown in open ground but also does well in large containers. It likes plenty of sunshine and some protection from cold winter winds so a west facing wall or patio is ideal. It is fairly drought tolerant and doesn't like to be in a waterlogged environment so ensure good drainage and water sparingly. A light feed along with pruning in late spring will ensure a healthy plant of a manageable size. Flowers and the black berries are not edible and it is the leaves you are after. Flavour is strongest in late summer and older dried leaves. Fresh leaves have a softer flavour and are easier to use.

I think one of the worries for gardeners in the coming year is another drought and hose pipe ban. Despite some very wet days my impression this has been a moderately dry winter which won't have helped our already depleted reservoirs. So what to do? Firstly ensure maximum rain collection from roofs and out buildings into water butts . From late spring put a thick layer of garden compost around all trees especially fruit trees and fruit bushes and raspberry canes to reduce evaporation.

When planting out brassicas , tomatoes or any large plant dig a hole at least twice the size of the root ball and fill with water. Keep filling with water until it drains away very slowly. Use plenty of water retentive compost and water in and then finally surround the plant with plenty of mulch to reduce evaporation. Hopefully by doing this you encourage the roots to go deep and thus becoming more resistant to drying out.

Don't forget to collect a schedule and start preparing for our first show!

CHAILEY REPAIR CAFÉ – WE ARE ON THE MOVE!!!

Happy New Year everybody! We start 2026 with some important news....

St Peter's Church is closing due to urgent repairs to the floor being refurbished from January onwards. Chailey Repair Café is moving back to Chailey Village Hall, (next to the Five Bells just 500 yards down the road from the Church) from 10th January until the work in the church is completed, when we will look forward to returning to the Church.

2025 was an outstanding year for the Repair Café – we tackled 736 of your repairs, 77% successfully, many of those on the day. Although we will always do our best to fix your item while you wait (we don't offer a drop off service) sometimes the repair is just too complicated. When that happens, it is possible that the volunteer will offer to take your item home to complete as a private arrangement outside the Repair Café – but please note that is not always possible..

Our most popular service was sharpening, followed by repairs to lamps, clocks, zips and radios.

And the strangest things we tackled? A hoverboard, a trimphone and a tiara! Oh and numerous stuffed animals including a dog, moth, pig, reindeer, squirrel, unicorn, furby, cuckoo, owl and monkey – we see all sorts at the Repair Café!!

Our 2026 dates are easy to remember – we are normally open every 2nd Saturday of each month between 10am – 1pm. Our new 2026 posters and flyers with all this year's dates are now available at the Café, so you won't forget!

Chailey Repair Café is part of a world-wide movement where volunteer experts repair things free of charge – although a donation towards running costs is invited. Anyone can bring along broken items or clothing needing repair from home, and have a cuppa and a cake while they wait!

You'll find us at Chailey Village Hall on the A275 next to the Five Bells pub normally on the second Saturday of each month (10th Jan, 14th Feb, 14th March and so on....) between 1000hrs and 1300hrs where we have a full Café service including our legendary cakes! Chailey Commons Society

After a cold, snowy and frosty start to the year, and the passing through of Storm Goretti with heavy rains, we are all looking forward to the advent of spring and we can already see the days beginning to lengthen.

A good start to the year was a talk from one of the commons neighbours, the artist Sacha Turnbull. Living locally and crossing the commons regularly, she has long been interested in the artistic aspect of the local landscape which she has illustrated in a wide selection of artist impressions. Her enthusiasm and quest for detail showed us a wonderful range of beautiful paintings which she has from both outdoor sittings and in her local studio. It

was lovely to see the heathland shown in this way as well as other scenes and still life too.

You may have noticed the effects of ongoing conservation management on the commons clearing swathes of bracken and scrub to restore the open habitats of the heathland. The heaps of flailed bracken may provide habitats for reptiles.

The five Exmoor ponies have been back on Red House Common since mid-December. Careful observations by the pony checkers show that they are foraging on a mixed diet of gorse, bramble, and grasses as well as some acorns which are hopefully less damaging now. During the cold snap in early January, they were given some top up hay. Their owner the Moorland Mousie Trust are confident that they will find adequate forage on the common and that the hay can be phased out. Please do not feed the ponies which can also endanger their health.

We are looking for two more pony checkers to join the team of volunteers. If you are able to commit to two checks per month on a rota and are interested in supporting the conservation grazing of the commons, please contact the Society on mail@chaileycommons.org.uk.

In last month's edition of Chailey News, we advised that Cabinet Councillors at Lewes District Council would be convening on the 11th December 2025 to approve the fourth public consultation regarding the draft Lewes Local Plan. The Plan was approved and is now open for public consultation.

The Plan represents a significant advancement in establishing the future development strategy for the district. Local plans are based on evidence, with data collected to determine where new developments—such as housing, employment spaces, and community facilities—are suitable and where they are not.

According to the government's formula for assessing housing needs, the district must plan for approximately 15,000 homes throughout the plan period, which concludes in 2042, for its designated area. Nevertheless, the Council's spatial strategy can only identify a housing need of around 8,570 new homes during this timeframe. This estimate is grounded in evidence and takes into account the limitations affecting the local plan area, including its borders with the South Downs National Park and the coastline.

It is vital that as many residents as possible take part in the consultation. A strong response is important because when the Plan is examined by the Planning Inspector, the level of community engagement and public support will be a key consideration.

The Parish Council will be meeting with Highways on the 10th March 2026. Such meetings happen twice a year and are an opportunity to be informed of and to discuss Highways' planned interventions, but also to discuss with Highways problems on the lanes and roads of Chailey. Fletching's 1880 Organ back in action

The Forster & Andrews pipe organ is now back in its place and was heard for the first time at the Carol Service in December.

During the last six months the organ has undergone a complete refurbishment by organ builders Andrew Cooper & Co. Many of the pipes went to a specialist in Leeds while other major components were taken to the workshop on the Isle of Wight. These are all now back in place and the restored elements are being regulated and fine-tuned as they bed in. In addition, the case work has been re-oiled to give it a fresh glow.

The church was packed for the Carol Service on 21st December, when the instrument was heard again for the first time, to the delight of the congregation. During January the organ builders continued to make final adjustments as the instrument settled down, to ensure it was ready for the rededication by Bishop Will on 25th January

The result is a tribute to the combination of craftsmanship and musicianship of the organ builders and their deep respect for the original work of Forster & Andrews, ensuring the organ will be good for another 100 years.






