Dear friends,

Welcome to the June edition of the St Peter's Chailey's Church & Community Magazine, please be praying for all our candidates from across the Deanery who are being Confirmed at St Mary's Newick on Monday 8th June 7pm.

June arrives with a different rhythm to the year. The long evenings stretch out before us, gardens burst into colour, and the Sussex countryside seems almost to hum with life. There is something deeply hopeful about early summer.

And there is lots to celebrate too, so please look out for all advertisements in this month's magazine for all the, Concerts, Open Garden's, Jumble sales, Plant sales and Food Fair's.

For many families in our communities of Chailey and Newick, June is also a demanding month. Young people are sitting GCSEs, A-levels, university exams, and end-of-year assessments. Parents and grandparents watch with encouragement and concern as revision timetables cover kitchen tables and nerves begin to fray. Teachers to carry the weight of supporting pupils through this intense season.

Exams can feel overwhelming because they ask so much of us. They test knowledge, certainly, but also resilience, confidence, and perseverance. Grace often arrives quietly.

Summer itself carries a spiritual lesson. The longer days invite us to slow down enough to notice the goodness around us. In a world that constantly urges us to hurry, produce, and achieve, June encourages us instead to pause and receive. The fields around Chailey and Newick, the birdsong in the early morning, and the simple pleasure of sitting outside in the evening light all speak of a Creator who delights in abundance and beauty.

Perhaps this June offers each of us an opportunity not only to enjoy the height of summer, but also to remember that God's faithfulness is woven through every season of life — in busy days and quiet evenings, in success and disappointment, in celebration and worry alike.

Please be assured that St Peter's Chailey and St Mary's Newick will continue to pray for all in

our villages, our schools, our farmers, our local businesses, our families across our wonderful communities and remember our Churches are open every day if you need a little time to come and be still, in the busyness of life.

Have a great month, be joyful, keep the faith and keep doing the little things that make a difference to those you love and those in need.

Lewes District Community Action Group – Update on Government Consultation, Local Government Reorganisation

It remains important that local voices are heard regarding the second consultation on the future shape of local government in East Sussex. Ministers are now seeking views on a revised proposal that would move Peacehaven, Telscombe, East Saltdean and Falmer into an expanded Brighton & Hove City Council from 2028.

This follows the earlier One East Sussex proposal, supported by all East Sussex councils, which recommended creating a single unitary authority for the whole county. That proposal highlighted the coherence of the current East Sussex and Lewes District boundaries. While the Government acknowledged its “positive strengths”, it has raised concerns about how it relates to the existing footprint of Brighton & Hove.

Under the new suggestion, around 24,000 residents would transfer from Lewes District to Brighton & Hove, with the remaining 537,000 people in East Sussex forming a new county-wide unitary council. Brighton & Hove City Council has argued that the change would support future housing and economic growth. However, the financial and organisational costs of dividing Lewes District are expected to be significant.

The consultation runs until 15 June, and the Government is asking whether the proposal would strengthen local government, its services and its finances.

Chailey Litter Pickers

The Litter Pickers continue to pick the roads and verges along the roads and lanes of Chailey, with the aim of keeping the village as clean as possible. We are an enthusiastic group of people with differing ages and backgrounds who meet once a month to do a group pick. It is amazing what a difference a relatively small group of people can make. It is also amazing the quantity of litter that we collect, mainly fast food wrappers and drinks cans discarded by drivers. So far this year, we have collected hundreds of full bin liners already.

As well as our usual monthly picks, we supported the Bonfire Society at the St Georges Fete in April, by picking the field both during and after the event. It was a beautiful warm spring day and we were very pleased to notice that there was relatively little litter across the site.

The group picks take place on different days of the week to enable as many people as possible to take part. In addition, some of the group pick their own areas as and when they are able to. The June group pick will be on Wednesday 9 June at 10.00am starting from the Free Church, South Chailey. Please come along and join us if you are free. Every bit helps!

We welcome new people to the group who are interested in helping to keep Chailey as clean and tidy as possible. There is no need for a regular commitment. Bin liners will be provided, as well as high-vis vests, gloves, grabbers, and hoops for those that need them. The more the merrier! Children over the age of 11 years are also welcome, but need to have an adult with them.

Please encourage everyone to help us by taking their litter home with them or using one of the many bins in the area!

CHAILEY REPAIR CAFÉ – MEET THE GENERALS!!!

Our April Repair Café was seriously busy, with some really excellent work being done by all our talented volunteers – more than 120 of you visited and you brought us some really tricky stuff!! Our 30 volunteers tackled an astonishing 82 repairs in 3 hours, with a 68% success rate.

So – who are our Generals? Well, if it's not an electrical item or something that needs sharpening or a fabrics repair, you'll be in the hands of our amazing General Repair team, which includes a joiner, a clock repairer (not always there, so please check first!), a ceramicist and jewellery repairer, a legendary engineer and a superb model maker. There's not much they can't successfully take on!!

It's a fair bet that there is some hot weather and holidays on the horizon, so if you go camping, look out that gear now and bring anything needing repair. We are doing a brisk trade in sharpening garden tools and getting those pesky lawnmowers to start and we can even fix those broken sunglasses, as we now have those tiny screws which hold them together... It's also now time to blow the dust off that bicycle in the shed and bring it to us to have a once over – we can also fix those kids' bikes which are so prone to going wrong at the hands of your little darlings!

May is the month when Repair Cafes nationally promote our work together under the banner "The Big Fix" This initiative was started 6 years ago and attracts positive publicity for the work done by the 424 Repair Cafes in the UK (when we opened in 2018, there were just 66!!) We are in a growth industry thanks to the support we have received from you all in the local community

Chailey Repair Café is part of a world-wide movement where volunteer experts repair things free of charge – although a donation towards running costs is invited. Anyone can bring along broken items or clothing needing repair from home, and have a cuppa and a cake and then watch while your repairs is done in front of you..

You'll find us at St Peter's Church, Chailey on the A275 at Chailey Green on the second Saturday of each month (9th May, 13th June, 11th July and so on) between 1000hrs and 1300hrs where we have a full Café service including our legendary cakes! We get busy, so please be patient if you have to wait for a while!

Chailey School

Chailey School has enjoyed a busy and successful few weeks with students taking part in a wide range of activities that support personal development, achievement and future aspirations. Outdoor learning has featured strongly, with Bronze Duke of Edinburgh students completing their navigation training in the local countryside. Making the most of the fields and woodland surrounding the school, students practised map and compass skills while building teamwork and resilience, supported by volunteer staff. Younger students have also been enjoying hands-on learning, with Year 7 and Year 8 launching an inter-form radish-growing competition, combining gardening, responsibility and friendly competition.

Students have also been actively exploring future pathways and celebrating individual achievements. Year 9 students recently took part in The Big Futures careers event, where they spoke with employers, colleges and training providers and developed key employability skills through practical activities both off-site and in school using Unifrog. Feedback from exhibitors praised Chailey students as polite, confident and articulate. Careers learning was further enhanced through an Open Doors visit to the Hydro Hotel in Eastbourne, giving students a valuable insight into the hospitality industry. We were also delighted to celebrate Amelia, who represented the school at the English Trampoline and DMT Championships at the University of Birmingham, finishing 14th in a highly competitive national event.

Alongside this work, Chailey School has been selected for the Tesco Stronger Starts community funding scheme, which helps fund careers trips and activities for students. Local residents can support the school simply by shopping at all Tesco stores in Burgess Hill or Haywards Heath and placing a token for Chailey School into the Tesco Stronger Starts collection boxes as they leave the store. Every contribution helps, and we are very grateful for the continued support of the local community in helping our young people thrive. The funding we have previously received from this programme has meant that we can offer all career related trips free of charge to all students and we hope to be able to do that again for academic year 2026/2027. Chailey Commons Society

It's been a record-breaking month in April again with just one mm of rain recorded locally. The previous low for this time of year was in April 2021 with just 2.5 mm. The May Early Bank Holiday weekend saw a break in the weather with variable rainstorms delivering 5 mm – more needed as it's still very dry.

Our outdoor activities have continued with our May bird walk on Red House Common, and we were lucky with a count of twenty-six species, even including a tawny owl calling! We saw and heard the migrants coming in and looking to the breeding season once again.

The ground nesting season is upon us and birds such as nightjar, stonechat and yellowhammer and reptiles such as adders are especially vulnerable to disturbance from dogs and people. Please can we ask that over all the commons dogs should be under close control between April and the end of July especially near the areas of high habitat suitability.

The Wildlife Refuges are clearly marked out by signs and fallen birch to give everything a good chance of success during this short and valuable season. The Refuges are one area on the northern slope of Red House Common and two areas of Memorial common. The public footpaths are not affected by any of these marked areas.

Thank you for your help and cooperation in keeping the areas quiet. The migrating Nightjars should be with us from May until August. We now monitor the number of nightjar territories and hope that the 7 territories we observed in total last year over all the commons, will be occupied again.

Please do not feed the ponies and enjoy them from a distance. If your property borders the commons, please do not be tempted to put any prunings or mowings onto the common. Grass mowings in particular can cause cholic in ponies and lead to serious disease and death and prunings may be poisonous. Furthermore, the added nutrients lead to a decline in the heathland wild flowers. Thankyou.

Chailey Horticultural Society

Our next event is the Summer Show on Saturday 25th July in the village hall from 2pm to 4pm. Please come and support us and have convivial and social afternoon. We will also be judging the children's potatoes in buckets competition.

We are now approaching the longest day and this year will be half spent. All frost tender plants are now outside in their final positions.

Apart from a few downpours and a hail storm in mid May the year so far has been quite dry. I expect this to continue so watering is going to be a daily task. It is always best to use rain water where possible as this dissolves oxygen in its descent and when stored in water butts remains at the best temperature for use. Remember water straight from the tap or a well maybe on the cold side for watering in hot weather. So if no rain and no hose pipe ban , keep your water butts full from the hose.

Water either early in the morning or in the evening but not during the heat of the day as much will be lost to evaporation and an increase in humidity may encourage fungal disease. Always water at the base of the plant and try and keep the leaves dry to avoid encouraging disease. With containers always water round the edge to ensure that the plant uses all the available space.

With tomatoes, sweet peppers , chillies and aubergine apply a weekly liquid feed as soon as the fruit has set. Aubergines may need the help of a fingertip to ensure fertilisation.

For tomatoes I strongly recommend a liquid seaweed based feed. Learned papers will exalt the value of seaweed for its trace elements, enhancement of growth and help with soil structure. However to me the great benefit of seaweed is , along with wood ash and horse manure, in the enhancement of flavour. After all tomatoes originate from the coastal regions of Peru and Chile and coastal communities have been aware of the value of seaweed for thousands of years, perhaps most notably in Jersey Royal potatoes.

The real enthusiast , perhaps with bored children or grandchildren , can collect seaweed from the beach a few days after an autumn gale. The washed up seaweed will have had the salt washed off by the rain and is free to collect and is even doing a service in cleaning the beach! Do not strip it from the rocks as this maybe illegal.

It is then best to shred it and place it on the ground where next year's potatoes and tomatoes are to be grown. Any left over can be added to the compost heap.

Inside tomatoes will usually support six trusses whereas those outside just four.

Powdery mildew is prevalent on outside cucumbers , courgettes , marrows and squashes and is encouraged by wetting the leaves. An old fashioned remedy is to spray the leaves with a mixture of one part full cream milk with ten parts water. I have never tried it!

In the greenhouse cucumbers are prone to red spider mite and aubergine and peppers to aphids. Both can be discouraged by a nightly fine spray of water.

Remember to pick courgettes and cucumbers regularly as once the fruit matures and starts producing seed the plant has done its duty and will stop producing.

With early broad beans remove the growing tip as soon as the lower pods are forming to reduce the risk of black fly. The tips can be used as a green vegetable rather like spinach.

By the end of the month first early potatoes will be ready to be dug. Dig as required and then add a little garden compost and plant out the leeks. With a dibber make a hole so all but the top couple of inches are in the ground and then fill with water. It is often said that you should trim the top and roots before planting but I don't think that this is necessary.

With greenhouse grapes allow one bunch per spur and stop it two leaves beyond the embryo bunch.

Check stone bearing fruit trees for any dead wood and tidy up as necessary. Make sure strawberries are well netted against birds and the fruit is off the ground to prevent rot and to discourage slugs.

Uckfield Lewes and Newick Arts Society

June 10th 2.30 in the Civic Hall Uckfield. Tirzah Garwood: Beyond Ravillious

Tirzah Garwood was the long suffering and often overlooked wife of Eric Ravillious. Tirzah's parents were both keen amateur artists and encouraged her to make botanical studies and draw scenes of fantasy and adventure. Having been head girl at West Hill School, she began studying at Eastbourne School of Art, attending full time from January 1926. The new teacher, a certain Eric Ravillious encouraged his students to experiment with wood engraving. Not surprisingly Tirzah took to this subject with alacrity. She portrayed ordinary life with a rare insight and often a sense of humour.

Life was never easy particularly after the death of her husband who died, on active service, in a plane crash during the second World War. As his body was never found the government was reluctant to pay her the widow's pension she was due, or even to settle Ravillious's outstanding pay, for over a year.

James Russell is an historian writer exhibition curator and lecturer specialising in 20th Century Art. His writing and outstanding research into his subjects quite rightly earned him 'Sunday Times Book of the Year' in 2024.

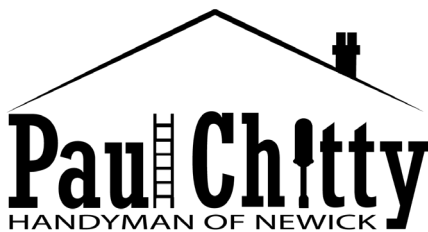

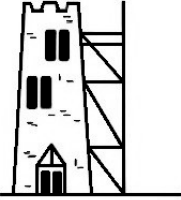

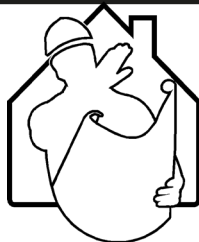
